APPELLATION HAUT-MÉDOC

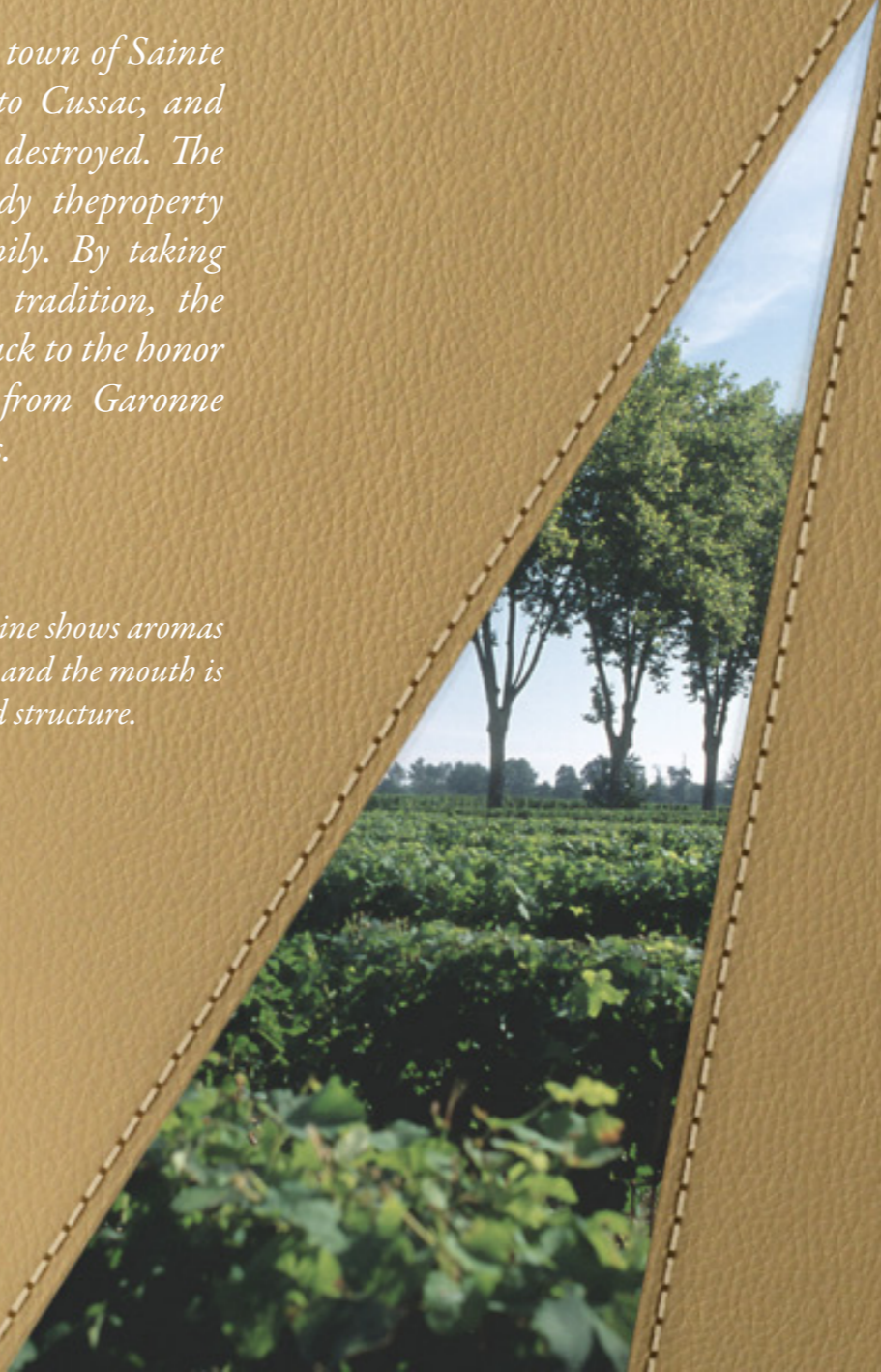

Back to 1793 the small town of Sainte Gemme was attached to Cussac, and the castle was already destroyed. The wine estate was already the property of the Laschenaye family. By taking up with the ancestral tradition, the Bouteiller family put back to the honor this terroir, composed from Garonne gravels above clay layers.

Tasting notes :

Expressive and fresh, this wine shows aromas of jammy fruits on the nose and the mouth is round and silky with a good structure.

Vineyard : 13 hectares

Soil : gravels from the Garonne and also sandy-clayey

*Grape varieties :
50 % Cabernet Sauvignon,
50 % Merlot*

Average age of vines : 20 years old

*Harvest : mechanical
with sorting-out tables*

*Winemaking : cold fermentation
to keep freshness and fruit aromas.
Short maceration to get wines with
supple and smooth tanins.*
