The history of this family property located in Begadan goes back to 1850. M. Figerou's grand-father was in charge of the vinification of the estate for many years, before joining the Saint-Jean de Begadan cooperative in 1959. In 1997, Château Begadanet left the cooperative and one year later, started to do its own vinification again.

It became Cru Bourgeois at the first classification in 1932.

Tastig notes: *Chateau Begadanet diversified terroir produces delighting wines, full of finesse and roundness, with exquisite aromas and flavors.*

Average age of the vines: 25 years

Vines culture:
Fabien Figerou grows and works his vines using rational viticulture, thus preserving the environment.

Aging: 80% in vats, 20% in barrels in which 70% in new barrels, and 30% in barrels of one wine
