Cuvée des Fontaines
de Stéphane Deroncourt

HAUT-MÉDOC

THE ESTATE: Located in the village of Saint-Sauveur, in the heart of the Haut-Médoc area, Château Le Broustey is a family estate originating from the union of the Martin and Tiffon families. Today it belongs to the heirs of the Martin family: Alain Martin is in charge of vinegrowing. André Martin, former Grand Cru's cellar master, looks after winemaking, assisted by Guillaume Martin. The many fountains of the village gave the name to this special cuvee created by Stéphane Deroncourt.

SOIL: The 5-hectare vineyard is located on the highest two gravelly hilltops of the village, 36 meters above sea level. Two third are made of gravels, on the top of the Saint-Sauveur plateau. One third being on clay and gravelly sandy soil.

DENSITY: 7,000 vines/ha

VINEGROWING: Grapes are selected with soft thinning and strong de-leafing. Manual and mechanic harvest for optimal ripeness. Each plot harvested individually.

AVERAGE AGE OF THE VINES: 29 years, some vines dating back to 1945

WINEMAKING: Fermentation in temperature controlled stainless steel vats

TASTING NOTES: Deep red color with purple tints. The nose reveals small black berries, vanilla and toasted notes. The supple palate offers a nice sweetness.
