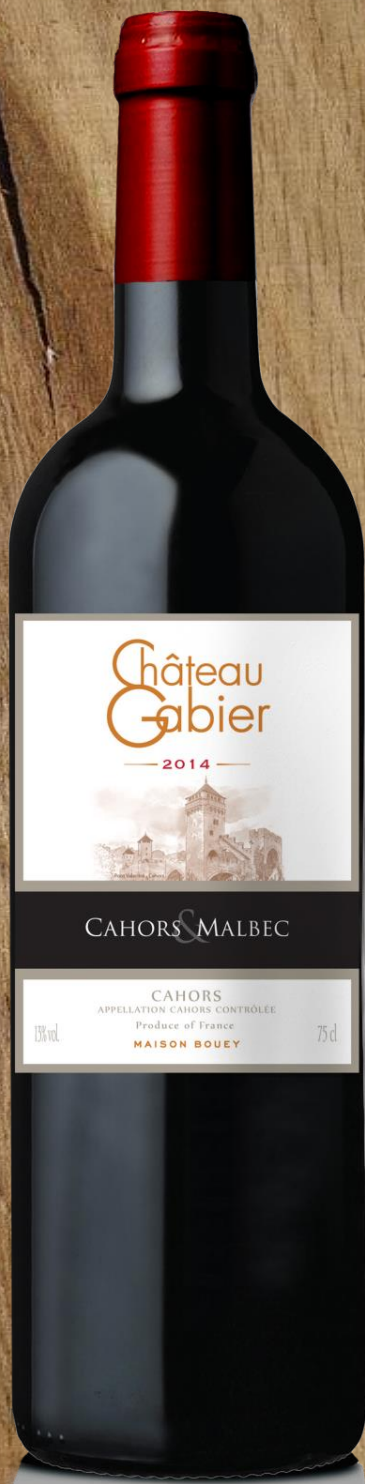


Château Gabier

AOC CAHORS



THE ESTATE: Since 4 generations, the Bouyssou family has been working 25 hectares of vines in 4 different terroirs in Cahors appellation. Located in the « Port de l'Angle », the estate benefits from exceptional history and situation.

The boom of the family estate dates from the XVIIIth century, when boats called gabares developed the wine trade, by transporting Cahors wine to Bordeaux.

Fisherman, winemaker, sailor, captain, strawberry growers... the Bouyssou line excels among the biggest « Black wine » growers.



SOIL: The estate extends on a siliceous soil. The average age of the vines is 35 years. Sensitive to the environment, the Bouyssou family works their vineyard in sustainable culture.

GRAPE: Malbec

A powerful and vigorous varietal, Malbec gets its best expression and outstanding character from the sunny lands and terroirs of its native Southwestern France vineyards of Cahors.

TASTING NOTES: Château Gabier presents a deep red color, almost black. The nose is aromatic with ripe fruits and slight violet notes. The palate is full, greedy with fine tannins. Nice aromatic length.
